Mr. Wistocki is a 30 year, decorated member of Law Enforcement, serving for 23 years as a member of SWAT team. He has authored the Illinois State texting and sexual exploitation of a child laws. Mr. Wistocki served as a member of the United States Secret Service Chicago Electronic Crimes Task Force (CECTF), The Illinois Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC), and as a High Technology Crimes Detective in Naperville Ill. He formed the Will County Illinois States Attorney's High Technology Crimes Unit that made over 90 sexual predator arrests in its first 3 ½ years and created a juvenile justice online program focusing on reform. He has dedicated his career to helping children by tirelessly pursuing, apprehending and prosecuting child predators.
